Effective January 1, 2008, California Senate Bill 742 increased the OHV green and red sticker registration fee to \$50 every two years.

This increased funding will be used to support OHV recreation in the State Vehicular Recreation Areas, at the OHV Recreation Division Headquarters of the Department of Parks and Recreation, and for grants and cooperative agreements to federal, county, and local OHV areas. Grants include Operations & Maintenance, Restoration, Law Enforcement and Safety & Education. Highlights of the bill are on the reverse side.

SENATE BILL 742 HIGHLIGHTS

OHV FEE AND STICKER CHANGE

- OHV Stickers—The green and red sticker fees have been increased to \$50 for two years of registration.

This will increase funding for the State Vehicular Recreation Areas and the Grants and Cooperative Agreements Program.

- OHV Sticker Appearances—The design of the green and red stickers will be changed with the identification numbers larger and easier to read.
- Program Sunset—January, 2018.

FEE USAGE

Up to 50 percent of total annual revenues will fund the following grant opportunities:

- Operations & Maintenance—50 percent of grant funding will go to acquisition, maintenance, operation, planning, development, or conservation of OHV recreation areas.
- Restoration—25 percent of grant funding shall be expended solely for grants and cooperative agreements for projects that provide ecological restoration or repair to habitat damaged by either legal or illegal OHV use.
- 20 percent local and federal law enforcement for personnel and related equipment.
- 5 percent education and training, comprehensive OHV and environmental responsibility education.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

- Inventoried Roadless Areas—Future trail maintenance would be limited on lands identified as inventoried roadless areas by the Forest Service, to those which were included in the National Forest Road and Trail System before January 1, 2009.

FINES

- Fines For Operation In Closed Areas—have been increased:
 - ✓✓ First offense: \$50; \$190 with court assessments.
 - ✓✓ Second offense, not to exceed \$75; \$298 with court assessments.
 - ✓✓ Third offense, not to exceed \$150; \$570 with court assessments. In addition, the court may assess costs sufficient to repair property damage resulting from the violation.
